

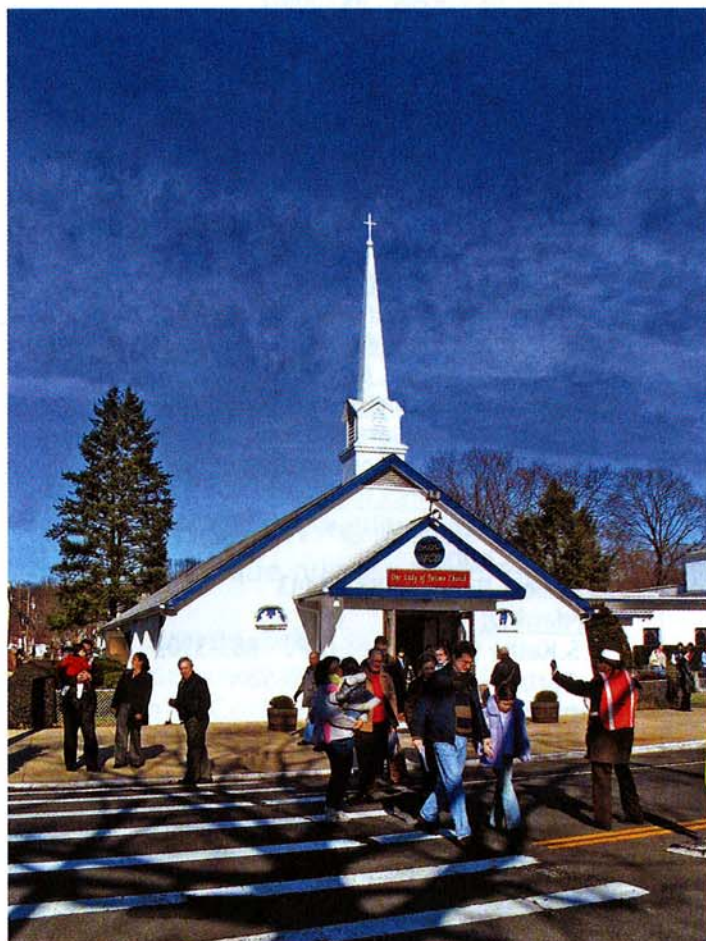

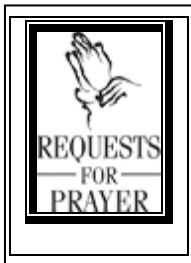

**Dear Friends,**

**This weekend we celebrate Gaudate Sunday! It marks the Third Sunday of the Advent season! On this day we light the third candle on our Advent wreath. It is the pink candle. It is a sign of joyful expectation; that the days of promise are near fulfillment. There is in the first reading from the prophet Zephaniah a message of great hope! We hear the beautiful words; "Shout for joy, O daughter Zion! Sing joyfully, O Israel! Be glad and exalt with all your**

heart, O daughter Jerusalem"! Paul proclaims in the letter to the Philippians that is our second reading: "Brothers and sisters: Rejoice in the Lord always. I shall say it again: Rejoice! The Lord is near! Have no anxiety at all"! The words proclaimed by Zephaniah and Paul so many years ago speak to people of endless ages. Just as these words filled those who heard them so many years ago, so they fill our hearts with that same joy, hope and peace. We are indeed much blest! We have been showered with the gift of God's great love. It is a love that is unconditional and has no limits. The rejoicing that we are invited to enter into is not a superficial one; rather it is one that comes from the depths of our hearts. We rejoice because we know that we have been loved into life by God and the gift of life is infinite. We know that God's love has been enfleshed by Jesus, who is the Christ and who has proclaimed the depths of God's infinite love. The gospel this weekend invites us to respond to so great a love. In the gospel from Luke we hear the prophet John the Baptizer proclaiming to all those who came to him for baptism that they should open their hearts to the needy and share with them all that they have. Today we might say that John calls them to a life of peace and justice. He calls them to have a compassionate heart and a willingness to enter into the process of life long transformation. In doing so we will become disciples, we shall become one with our God! Let us indeed rejoice this day! Let us take time to celebrate and prayerfully reflect on the presence of the Lord, our God in our midst! With thankful hearts we en flesh the gospel in our own hearts and follow the Lord on the path of the gospel.

## OLF GIVING TREE

Last year because of the economy and the number of families in need, we asked for gift certificates on our tree rather than gifts. They worked out really well, so we will again be using gift certificates this year.

As you will see on the tree this week, each ornament will have a Family Number so we can identify which family it goes to when it is returned. It will then state either a gift certificate for food or clothing. The clothing certificate is for an individual family member (not the whole family). The certificates for food will go to the family to help buy groceries. Large families will have two ornaments for food. Some families will have an ornament for a gas gift card or metro card. On Sunday, December 20<sup>th</sup>, each of these families will receive a "family stocking" with certificates for clothing for each member and a gift certificate(s) for food/and or transportation for the family.

We invite you to take an ornament from the tree and purchase the gift certificate that is listed on the label. Please bring the gift certificate and the ornament (so we know which family the certificate is for and also so we can use the ornament again next year) to church with you on the weekend of Dec. 19<sup>th</sup> and 20<sup>th</sup>. The gift certificates can be brought to the center after all the Masses except the 11:30 am. For the 11:30 am Mass we ask that you bring your gift certificates before Mass so we can begin fixing the "family stockings" at noon.

Esta semana celebramos el domingo "Gaudete" (Regocíjense), el tercer domingo de Adviento. Este día encendemos la tercera vela de la Corona de Adviento, la vela rosada. Esta es una señal de expectativa alegre que los días de promesa se acercan a su cumplimiento. En la primera lectura del profeta Sofonías se encuentra un mensaje de gran esperanza. Oímos estas palabras bellas: "Canta, hija de Sión, da gritos de júbilo, Israel, gózate y regocíjate de todo corazón, Jerusalén."
